From the Principal...

Families,

'Big Ideas in Number'

Since mid-last year staff started professional learning with a goal to lift all student achievement in mathematics – specifically in number.

To reach this goal we have (as identified in our Site Improvement Plan 2019 – 2021), a focus on teachers implementing structured mathematical thinking and teaching processes. We have intentionally been learning the 'Big Ideas in Number' approach to teaching - which through diagnostic tasks, exposes critical aspects of student thinking in relation to Number.

What are the Big Ideas in Number?

The following key concepts are essential for meaningful engagement in number learning – as identified by Professor Dianne Siemon.

Big Idea	Description
Trusting the Count	developing flexible mental objects for the numbers 0 to 10

Place value	moving beyond counting by ones, the structure of the base 10 numeration system
Additive to Multiplicative thinking	moving from a count of equal groups (eg 1 six, 2 sixes, 3 sixes, 4 sixes, ...) to a constant number of groups (eg 6 ones, 6 twos, 6 threes, 6 fours, 6 fives ...), the key to understanding rational number and developing efficient mental and written computation strategies in later years
Partitioning	the missing link in building common fraction and decimal knowledge, understanding and confidence
Proportional reasoning	extending what is known about multiplication and division beyond rule-based procedures to solve problems involving fractions, decimals, per cent, ratio, rate and proportion
Generalising	skills and strategies to support equivalence, recognition of number properties and patterns, and the use of algebraic expressions

When teachers interpret the responses from students through the diagnostic tool, they are then able to plan appropriate strategies for each child to progress in number.

Teachers are currently using the Big Ideas in Number diagnostic resources to determine how best they support all our students when thinking and working with number.

In future newsletters I will provide more information about this school priority to improve our student's achievement - specifically a more in-depth look at *'Trusting the Count, Place Value and Additive and Multiplicative thinking'*.

Three Way Interviews: Upcoming in week 9, 23rd - 25th of March.

Teachers have allocated available times on the above days to meet for three-way interviews. I expect that if you cannot make a time to meet about your child's learning progress, you make alternate times with the teacher.

Student Wellbeing Thought – Being the Master of your feelings, not the Victim

Are my feelings in charge of my actions or is my thinking in charge?

The above statement is a key piece of learning for kids as they grow to become responsible community members. Learning how to adjust from emotionally motivated actions to thinking based actions is taught at

Seaview Downs Primary School through Play Is The Way activities. These activities are designed to purposefully place students in uncomfortable situations, which stimulate thinking-based responses from individuals and groups, as opposed to emotional based responses.

Coronavirus disease (COVID-19) update

The Federal Government has updated its advice on coronavirus disease (COVID-19).

Restrictions are in place for people who have recently returned to Australia from Iran or mainland China, with the following advice issued to staff and parents about attendance at schools and early childhood facilities.

In the following scenarios you **cannot** attend school or an early childhood centre:

- If you have left, or transited through Iran on or after 1 March - you must [isolate](#) yourself until 14 days after leaving Iran.
- If you have left or transited through mainland China - you must [isolate](#) yourself until 14 days after leaving China.
- If you have been in close contact with a confirmed case of novel coronavirus - you must [isolate](#) yourself for 14 days after last contact with the confirmed case.

At this stage, the Federal Government advises that travellers from Hong Kong, Indonesia, Japan, Singapore, Thailand, South Korea, Italy and Cambodia who have not been to mainland China or Iran are not required to self-isolate unless they are unwell, in which case they should seek medical assistance.

Practising good hygiene

Everyone can protect against infections by practising good hygiene. Encourage all children and staff to:

- wash their hands regularly, particularly after using the toilet and before eating
- avoid spreading infections to others by keeping children home if they are unwell
- cover a cough or sneeze with a tissue


