Dear families,

I once again thank you all for the resilience with updates and communications from and to the school. As I sent out on Tuesday 29th March via seesaw to all classes, we have been guided to maintain existing settings of covid safe measures until the end of term, including the continued restriction on assemblies and indoor events. The AGM scheduled for next Tuesday has been postponed until term 2 – as instructed by my Education Director.

Canteen operations – Governing Council

Last week a survey in relation to canteen operations was sent to families. I thank all respondents and provide you with Canteen Service 2022 – Survey responses:

Out of 65 responses:

- 95% responded with wanting a food service (canteen) 62/65
- 42% responded with commitment to volunteering 27 Yes/ 38 No

In relation to potential time frequency can volunteer, the responses were:

- 19% Weekly 6/65
- 38% Fortnightly 12/65
- 38% Monthly 12/65
- 6% Termly 2/65

This community response has been presented to Governing Council members. Engaging a canteen sub-committee through Governing Council early in Term 2 is a priority to manage re-opening a canteen service.

Please consider your time to support the canteen from term 2. Committee members do not have to be members of Governing Council (aside from one Governing Council representative who will chair the sub-committee and report back to the Governing Council).

When the Easter holiday break does arrive for all families – I wish you all a safe and enjoyable time. Once again, thanks for supporting the staff and students this term.

GUIDELINES

The NATURE theme: your entry must be inspired by a book about nature in South Australia, such as plants, animals, bushland, beaches, parks or perhaps your garden at home.

The SPACE theme: your entry must be inspired by a book about space such as human spaceflight, the planets and universe, satellites, space travel and astronomy.

THE PRIZES

All individual students will receive a certificate of participation.
