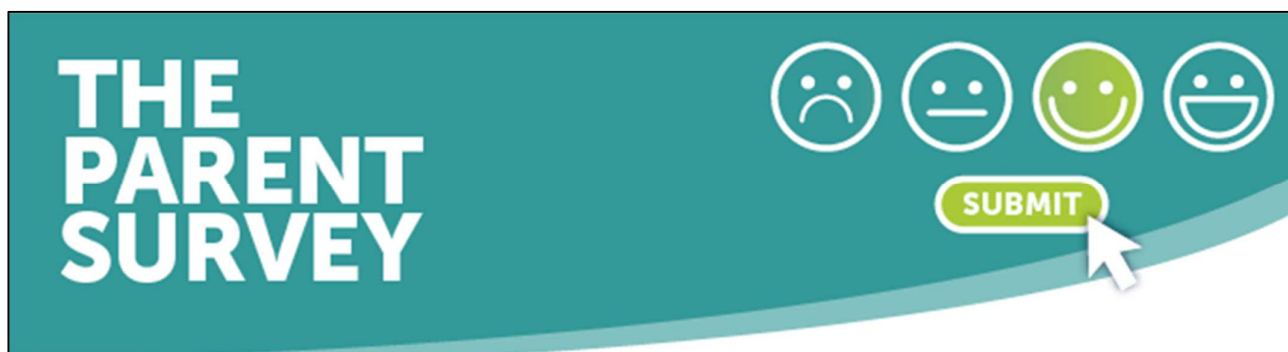
The start up meeting for our replacement build of the school buildings has been scheduled for September the 13th. I expect to be able to keep you up to date with the plans from this date forward.

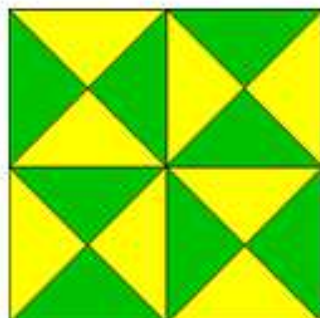
