October Vacation Care

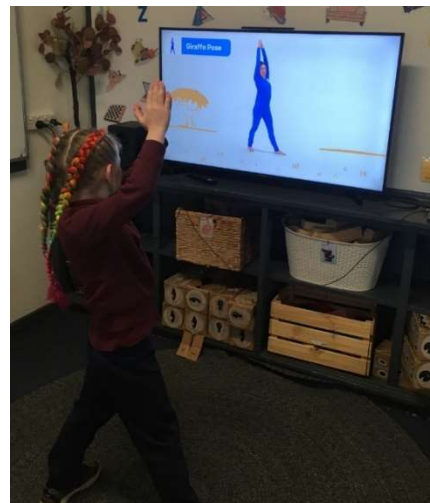


