

Absent notifications


Absentee notifications can now be sent through from our website!


From the classroom - Room 2A

Lending Library

Parents

Parent involvement is not only encouraged but it is Vital for our OHSC to operate effectively. If your child is unwell or has an illness that may be infectious, please keep them at home and advise staff. You will need to provide a medical certificate to enable refund of session.


