Premier's Reading Challenge 2023

The Premier's Reading Challenge (PRC) is on again this year, forms have been given to teachers for their classes. The Premier's Reading Challenge is a literacy engagement program that was introduced by the Premier in 2004 to encourage students to read more books and enjoy reading and improve literacy levels.

The Challenge requires students to read 12 books between the beginning of the school year and early September, 8 of which need to be from the Premier's Reading Challenge booklist and the other 4 books can be personal choice. Students are encouraged to read books appropriate to their reading level and from a variety of genres. Please encourage your student/s to participate – the library has a many PRC books from the library – PRC books are easily identifiable as they are labelled with green dots on the spine for Reception to Year 2, yellow dots for Years 3 – 5 and red dots for Year 6.

The Resilience Project

This year, we are excited to bring The Resilience Project (TRP) into our school community!

The Resilience Project is committed to teaching positive mental health strategies to prevent mental ill-health and build young people's capacity to deal with adversity.

We will be implementing their evidence-based Teaching and Learning Program throughout our classrooms, staffroom and school community.



Every Tuesday, teachers and students will engage in a weekly lesson and activities around the key principles of Gratitude, Empathy, Mindfulness (GEM) and Emotional Literacy to build resilience.

Fortnightly in term 1, families will be sent a series of clips via Sentral, introducing key concepts of the program. <u>We</u> would really appreciate if families took the time to watch these and complete the activities as a family. Some weeks a 'Take Home' activity will be sent home after a lesson which will strengthen the understanding of the concept explored during the lesson at school. <u>Family engagement is crucial to the program's success</u>.


