Dear Families,




World's Biggest Gratitude Event:

GRATITUDE

Some benefits of practising gratitude are:

- After 21 days, you start to scan the world for positives.
- After 42 days you become:
 - More optimistic, energised & focused.
 - Less likely to get sick.
- You will sleep better.
- Anxiety and depression decreases.

A few quick and simple ways to practise being grateful are:

- Journaling; each night write down 3 things that went well for you that day or purchase a
 gratitude journal with gratitude prompts.
- Write a gratitude letter to someone special, telling them why you are grateful they are in your life.

In Room 20, we explored how gravity and objects apply force. We made paper helicopters and dropped them from a height to see what would happen. We noticed that both the large helicopter and the small helicopter spun and fell to the ground as we dropped them.

Some of the children noticed that both of their helicopters fell at the same rate, whilst others noted that one was faster than the other.

Through this experiment we were able to understand that gravity pulls us down, 'keeps us grounded' but also that objects use force to push against gravity, which is why the helicopters spun as they fell to the ground.


