Dear Families,

This term has already started with a busy schedule for all learners and staff.

In week one all children engaged in First Aid training for kids. This was followed by some fun with Hats off to Teachers – for World Teachers Day on Friday last week, and then the Halloween Disco the same evening. Next week our reception to year fives will be having swimming lessons.

Our staff profile has had some additions with Natalie Hinic and Samantha Bent joining our Support Services team; Natalie working at the administration desk, and Samantha in classrooms.

Speaking of administration/ office staff, we have now deployed a digital sign in and out for students and visitors, reducing transfer time for admin services efficiency. Our staff will assist you with this new learning when you sign in or out – it is reasonably intuitive.

As you may have been aware, on the very first day of this term the Minister for Education, Training and Skills, Blair Boyer visited to announce additional funding for the rebuild of Seaview Downs beginning 2024. This is exciting as now we have confirmation about starting, plans finalised and the finances to deliver a great new environment.

At the moment adjacent the gymnasium a stormwater management upgrade in underway (separate from the facility renewal) to ensure the areas around the grounds sheds and gymnasium are more useable and less impacted by water runoff into the future. Additional storage and access to the area is also in the pipeline – to get the blue chairs and other equipment out of the gym, but close by.

This term Mrs. Nicolle Snell, 'Sensei', has been recognised for 30 years of service to the Department for Education at this time. Thanks, Sensei, for the outstanding engagement and care over this time, we know it will continue for time to come.


































Lunchtime Legends


