

This term we have been focusing on strengthening Quality Area 1 and Outcome 1 from the National Quality Standards. Educators have been responding to children's ideas and play through open ended questions. Educators have found children have been enjoying outdoor play including using our new sports equipment on the courts and playing on the playground. Children feel safe, secure and supported.

What to know what we have been up to?

Every day we have our program and snack listed on our white board as well as what staff are on for the day. We also update families on our Seesaw app with photos, observations and pieces of students work.

SNACK

We follow the rite bite policy when we create our menu. Green foods are available throughout the whole session including fruits and vegetables. We serve a small green or yellow snack later in the afternoon. Snack times vary depending on children's engagement in activities. We ensure children get their snack before they go home.






